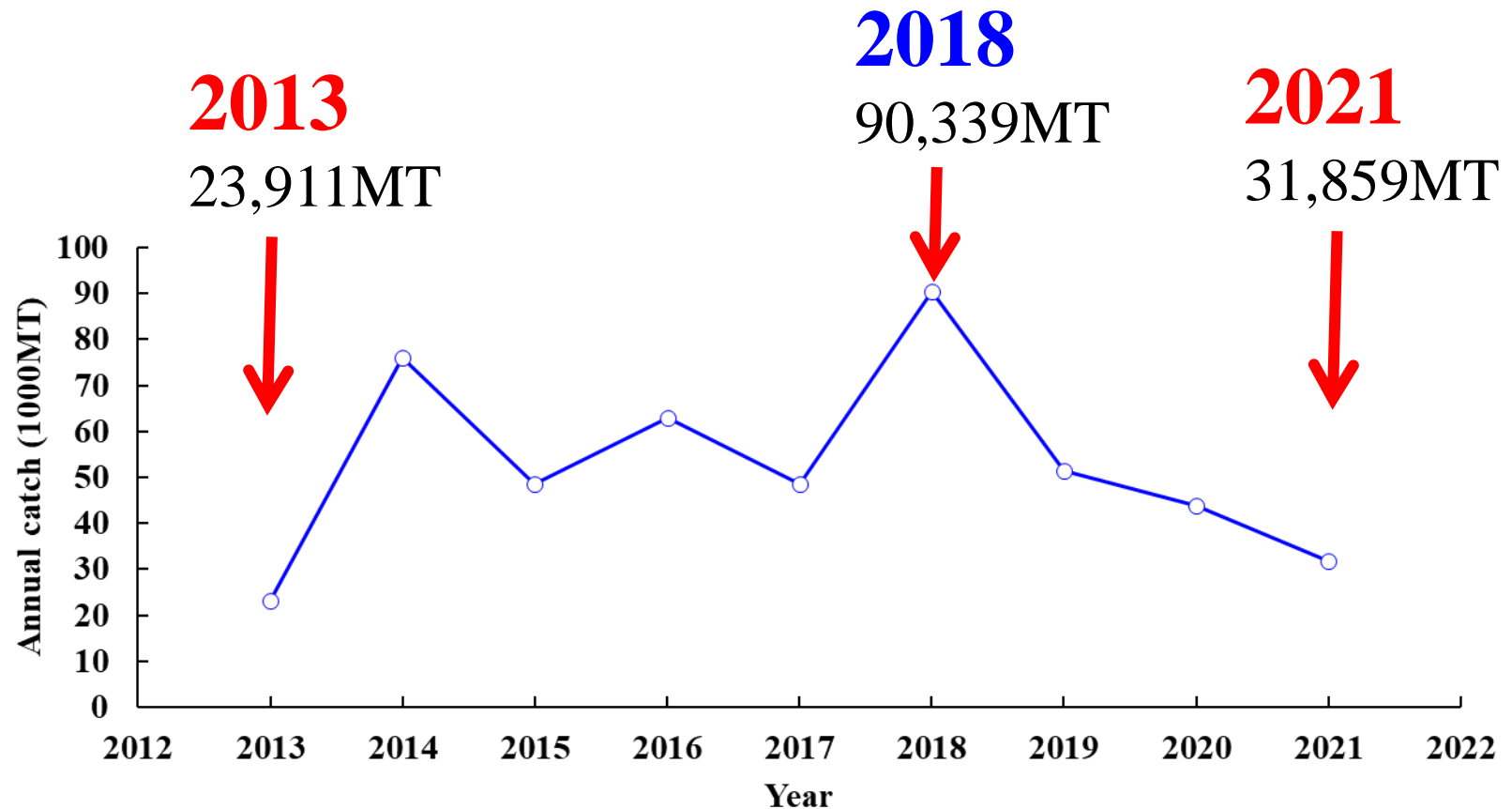

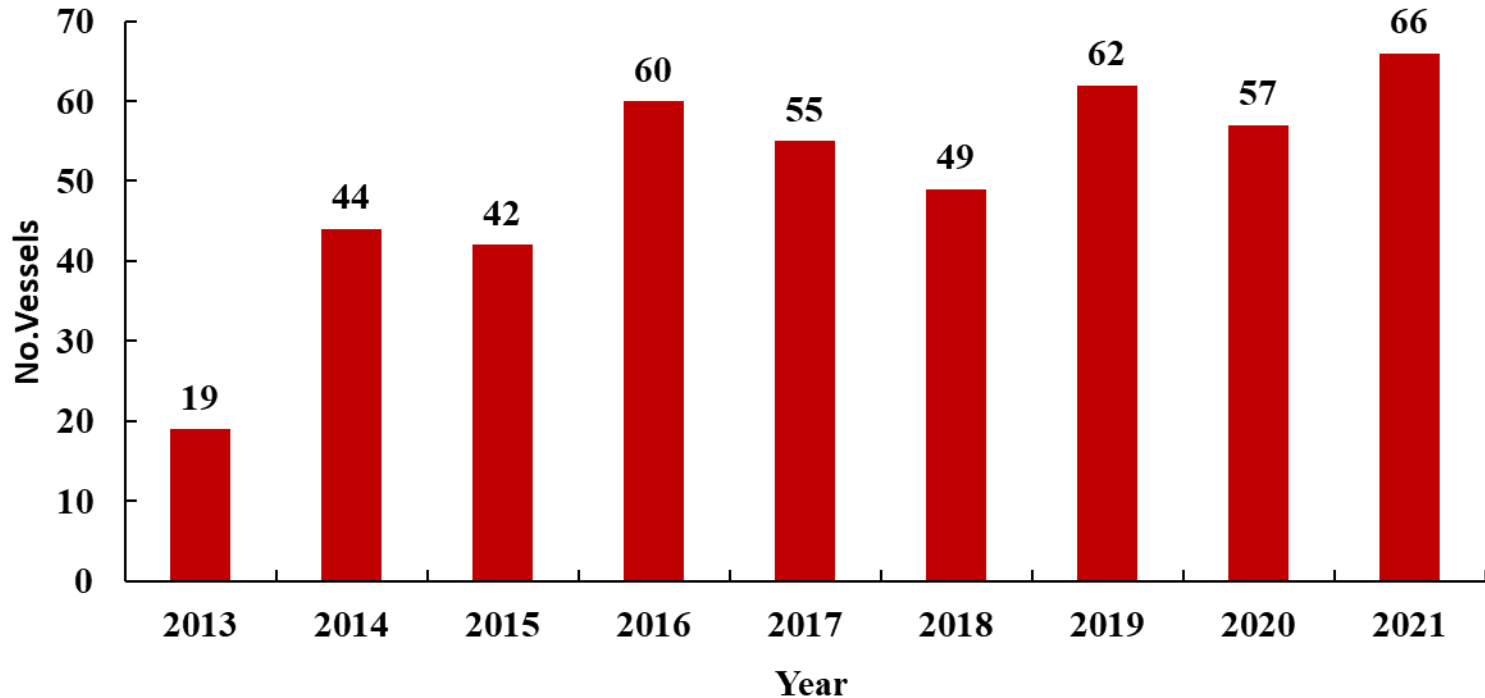

# 1. Annual catch



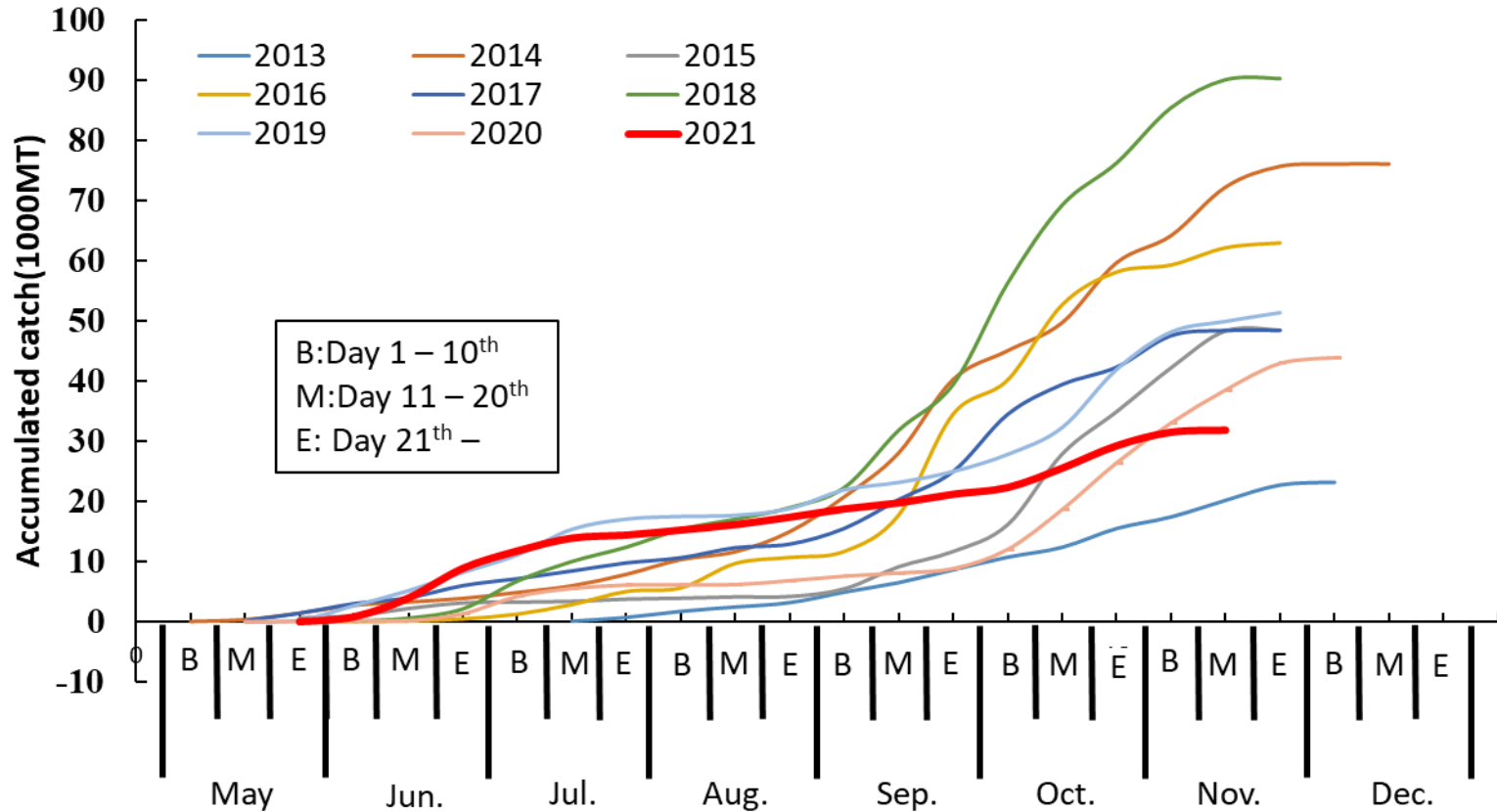
- **China's Pacific saury fishery in the Northwest Pacific Ocean began in 2003.**
- **The main fishing gear of Pacific saury fishery is the stick-held dip net.**
- **The annual catch continues to decrease since 2018.**
- **Total catch in 2021(till Nov.13) was 31,859 MT**

## 2. Number of vessels



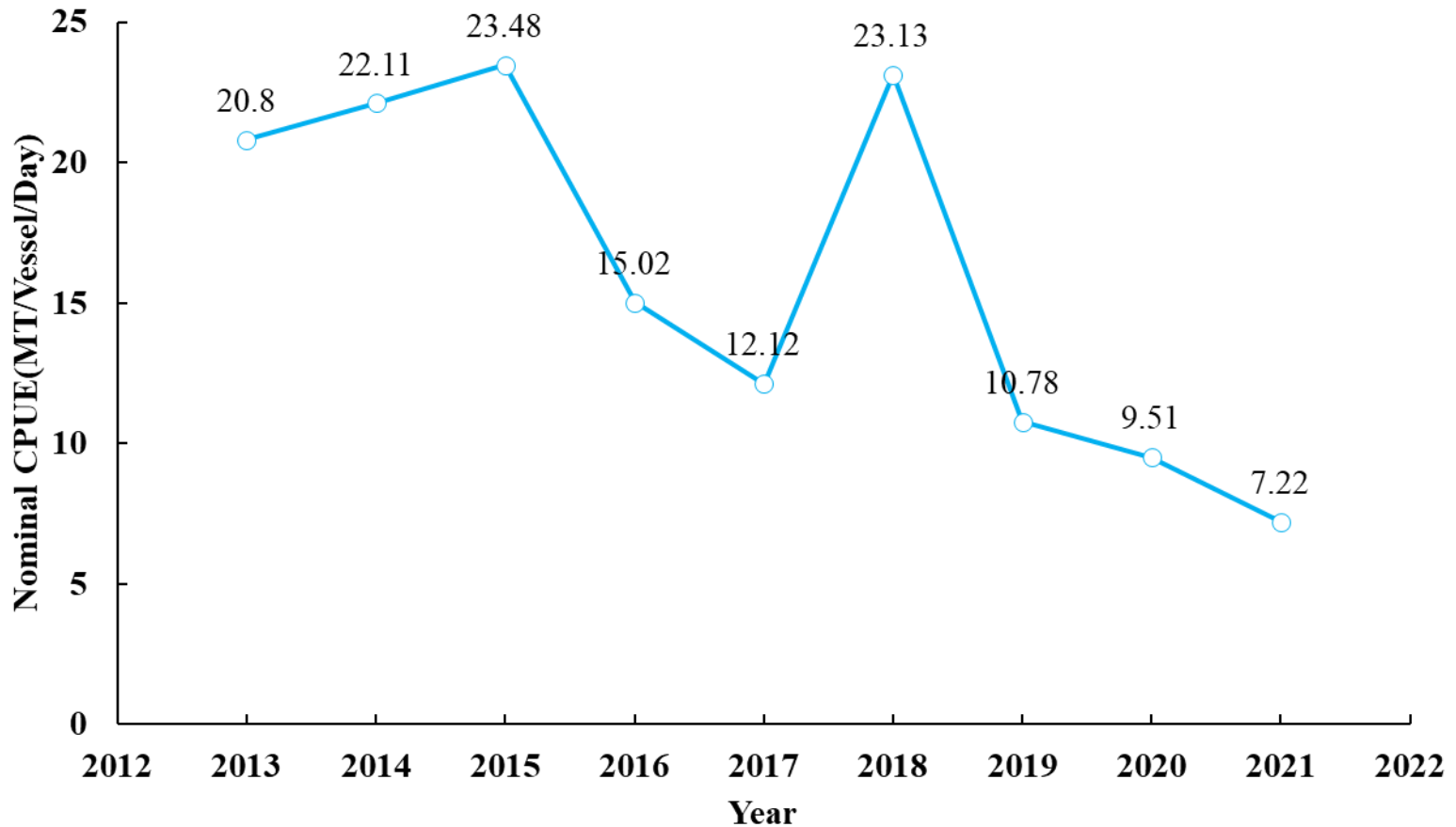
- **Sixty-six fishing vessels are operating**

# 3. Accumulated catch



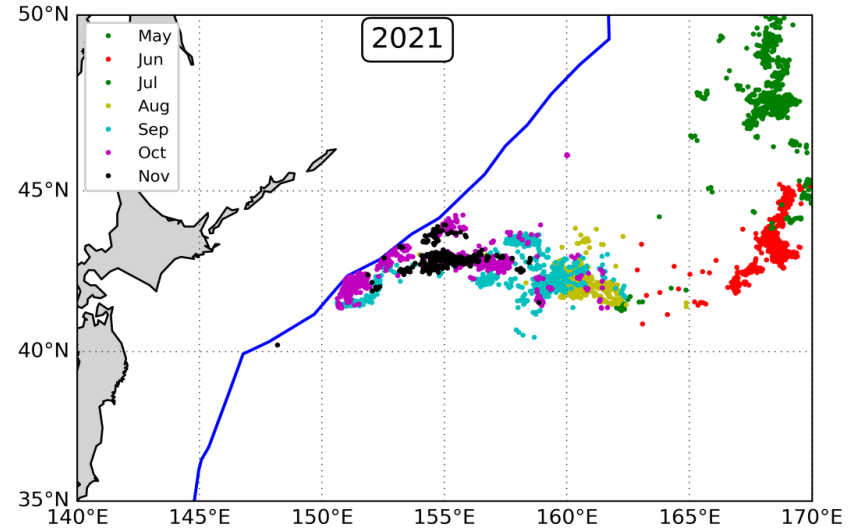
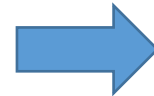
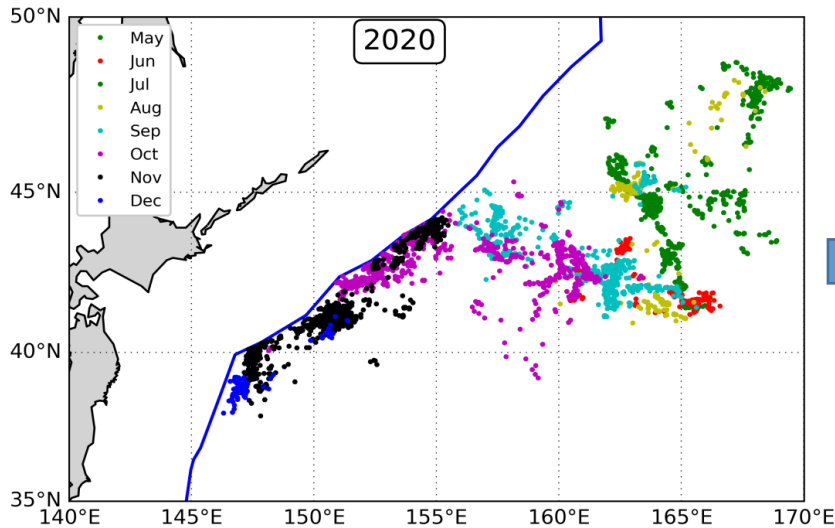


# 5. Nominal CPUE



➤ **Nominal CPUE was 7.22MT/Vessel/Day and lowest since 2013.**

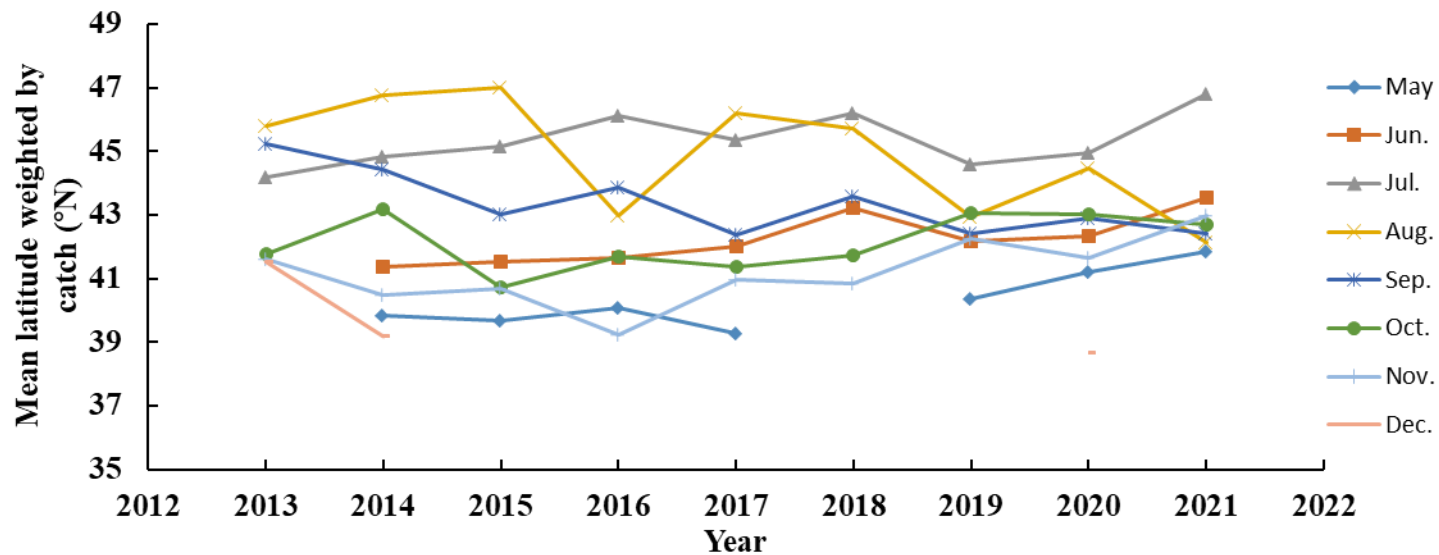
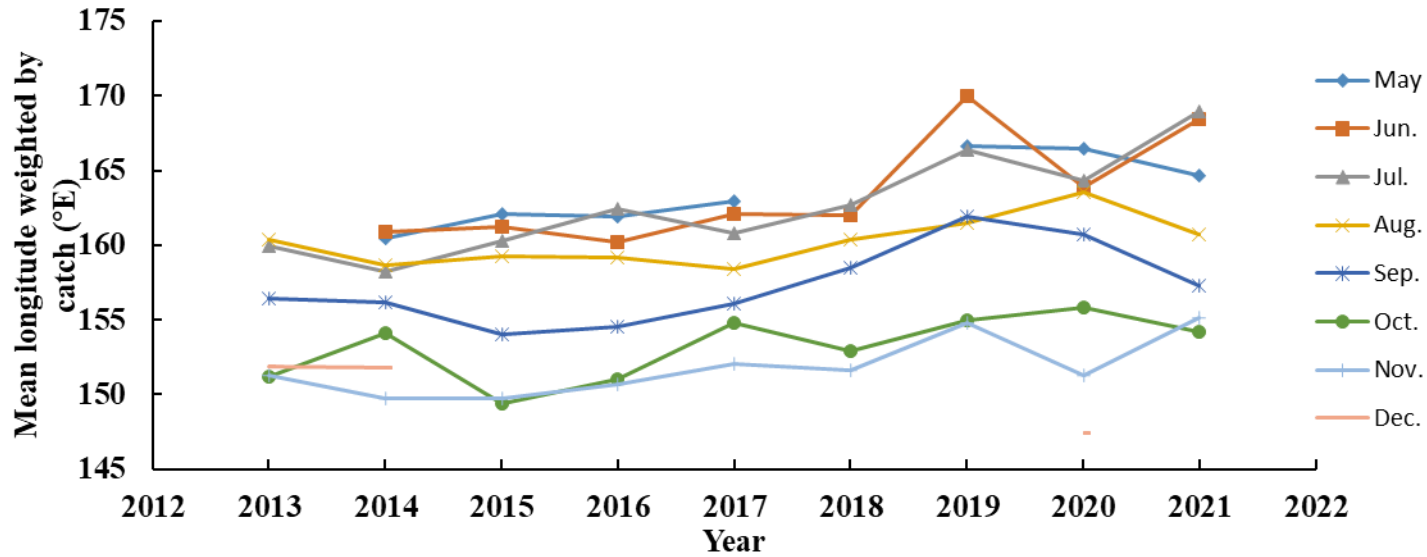
# 6. Fishing grounds
